A. Call to Order/Roll/Determination of a Quorum.

The Virginia Manufactured Housing Board meeting was held in Richmond, Virginia, Thursday, March 17, 2011. Chairman Roncaglione called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Lorenzo Dyer, Secretary to the Board, performed the roll call and a quorum was present.

B. Approval of the Minutes.

Notice to Board Members: Minutes are a record of what was done at a meeting and not a record of what was said at a meeting.

A motion was made by Ben Flores to accept the minutes from the Board's meeting of December 2, 2010. William H. Moody seconded the motion, and the Minutes were accepted as written by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Ben Flores to accept the minutes from the Board's meeting of January 20, 2011. Earl T. Satterwhite seconded the motion, and the Minutes were accepted as written by a unanimous vote.

C. Public Comment.

D. Committee Reports.

1. Educational Program Committee.

A report of the Educational Program Committee was presented to the Board concerning the directions in the development of PSA's for public announcements of the Virginia Manufactured Housing Board; and presenting information of the Board's responsibilities by educating and protecting the consumers who purchase a manufactured home.

2. Jack Proctor/Retired Former Deputy of the Division of Building & Fire Regulations of the Department of Housing and Community Development, Richmond, Virginia.

A report of the passing away of Jack Proctor and funeral services was announced.

3. Virginia Manufactured Housing Board Committee Telephone Conference.

A report was presented of the Committee Telephone Conference that was held on February 21, 2011 concerning developing policies and procedures for the Board and staff. A decision was made by the Committee to present the information gathered and a recommendation will be presented to the full board at a later date.

E. Report of the Secretary/Associated Director/Deputy Director Reports.

1. Manufactured Housing Consensus Committee Meeting (A Guiding Authority).

This report comes from HUD which consists of updating and improving the manufactured housing federal construction standards on a regular basis with other code enforcement regulations. The Department of Energy has been assigned to develop the energy provisions of the Federal Manufactured Housing Regulations. Tentative effective date for public comments is December 2011; adoption for the regulation's tentative year is 2012. Those regulations will be incorporated into the HUD Regulations.

The Manufactured Housing Installation Class was held on March 16, 2011 with 23 participants. The next class will be held in June 2011.

As of today, the Transaction Recovery Fund Regulations has not been approved by the Governor's Office. New books for the Regulation will be printed once the Governor's Office approves the new regulations.

On November 9, 2010, an Informal Fact-Finding Conference was convened at the Department of Housing and Community Development. The Board reviewed the evidence and the summary report of the IFF.

A motion was made by Walter K. Hughes, Sr. that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (22) on Count 1 and Jim Carver seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Walter K. Hughes, Sr. that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (7) on Count 2 and Earl T. Satterwhite seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Jim Carver that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (21) on Count 3 and Ben Flores seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

Walter K. Hughes, Sr. made a motion to accept all of the fines approved for the monetary penalty of \$1,000.00. The motion was seconded by Earl T. (Tom) Satterwhite. Chairman Roncaglione led a discussion on the motion and the second. As a result of the discussion, Walter K. Hughes, Sr. withdrew the motion. Earl T. (Tom) Satterwhite withdrew the second to the motion.

On Count 2, Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. having been found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (7) to accepts staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$250.

On Count 3, Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. having been found in violation of 13 VAC 6-20-170 (21) and accepts staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$250 and Ben Flores seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

2. Informal Fact-Finding Conference - Case Number 2010-31, Antonio and Leticia Castro v Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. (Transaction).

Walter K. Hughes, Sr. made a motion that on Count 1 of 13 VAC 6-20-170 (A) (7) to accept staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$1,968.10 to Antonio and Leticia Castro and Ben Flores seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

3. Informal Fact-Finding Conference – Case 2010-19, Jocelyn and Neville Connolly v Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. (Disciplinary).

Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

5. Informal Fact-Finding Conference – Case Number 2010-24, Jorge and Rebecca Romero v Virginia Mobile Home, Inc. (Disciplinary).

On November 9, 2010, an Informal Fact-Finding Conference was convened at the Department of Housing and Community Development. The Board reviewed the evidence and the summary report of the IFF.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (22) on Count 1.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (7) on Count 2.

Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (A) (7) and accept staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$2,110.00 to the Jorge and Rebecca Romero and Earl T. Satterwhite seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

7. Informal Fact-Finding Conference – Case Number 2010-25, Martin Flores Rodriguez v Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. (Disciplinary).

On November 9, 2010, an Informal Fact-Finding Conference was convened at the Department of Housing and Community Development. The Board reviewed the evidence and the summary report of the IFF.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (A) (22) on Count 1.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (A) (7) on Count 2.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (A) (21) on Count 3 and Earl T. Satterwhite seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (A) (22) and accepts staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$500 on Count 1.

Eric C. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

8. Informal Fact-Finding Conference – Case Number 2010-29, Martin Flores Rodriguez v Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. (Transaction).

On November 9, 2010, an Informal Fact-Finding Conference was convened at the Department of Housing and Community Development. The Board reviewed the evidence and the summary report of the IFF.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that on Count 1, Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (A) (7) to accept staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$2,092.00 to Martin Flores Rodriguez and Walter K. Hughes, Sr. seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

G. Old Business.

1. Salesperson License - Sherry Moorefield.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion to grant Sherry Moorefield a salesperson's license to sell manufactured homes and Ben Flores seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

Discussion: Staff requested directions from the Board due to no report(s)/additional information was provided concerning Sherry Moorefield. A notice was made known to Ms. Moorefield to appear at the March 17, 2011 Board Meeting and to provide additional information, if available.

After much discussion, Eric C. Anderson made a motion to table this issue until the next meeting to have additional information be submitted from Ms. Moorefield. Chairman Roncaglione called the question to be made by hand votes and the motion was carried by six voting yes, one voting no and one abstaining.

Discussion: Staff was requested to gather information to be presented at the next meeting regarding background checks for licenses.

1. Chantel Lynn Parish v Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc.; Case Number 2011-1 (Disciplinary)

Based upon the evidence and the IFF, the following is recommended regarding the Counts as outlined in the Report of Findings.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Home, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (22) on Count 1.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Mobile Home, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (7) Count 2.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Manufactured Housing, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (21) on Count 3 and Walter K. Hughes, Sr. seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Manufactured Housing, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (22) to accept staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$500 on Count 1.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Manufactured Housing, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (7) to accept staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$250 on Count 2.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that Virginia Manufactured Housing, Inc. is found in violation of 13-VAC 6-20-170 (21) on Count 3 to accept staff's recommendation to be assessed a monetary penalty of \$250. Jim Carver seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

2. Chantel Lynn Parish v Virginia Mobile Homes, Inc.; Case Number 2011-2 (Transaction)

Based upon the evidence and the IFF, the following is recommended regarding the Counts as outlined in the Report of Findings.

Eric C. Anderson made a motion that on Count 1, Virginia Manufactured Housing, Inc. is found in violation of 13 VAC 6-20-170 (7) to accept staff's recommendation that the regulant reimburse the buyer, the amount of \$1,908.70 to Chantel Lynn Parish. Earl T. Satterwhite seconded the motion. Chairman Roncaglione called the question and the motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

The Board requests clarification from the Office the Attorney General in writing regarding what should be included in the minutes as may relate to previous minutes; and provide instructions on how the Board should formulate its voting procedure when the vote includes multiple "Counts" that are related to a case on the agenda and is information that is made inclusive to the minutes.
