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Ms. Williams,

I know that we have exceed the requested date for submission, but the Town of Front Royal would offer the following items for consideration by the Committee during any future discussions:

- 1) DEQ Nutrient Removal Requirements - The State through DEQ has established nutrient removal requirements for wastewater treatment plants that discharge into tributaries of the Chesapeake Bay. To meet these strict requirements, the Town is facing a \$40 million upgrade. The State has provided assistance to some communities, but has failed to establish sufficient funding to the QIF program once its funds were exhausted.
- 2) VDOT Urban Maintenance Funding - Preliminary reports have been released that the State is considering reducing road maintenance funds to municipalities through lowering the per mile funding for local roads. While VDOT does not prioritize maintenance on roads with this classification, the citizenry of local governments reside on these street and deserve local streets that are pothole free and cleared of snow. Reduction of maintenance funding will have a dramatic impact on local governments continuing to provide the level of service expectations of our citizens.
- 3) "599" Funding - Preliminary reports have indicated that the State is once again considering reducing funding for local law enforcement. Again, any reduction in this funding will have dramatic impact on local governments continuing to provide the level of service expectations of our citizens.
