Historic Staunton Guided Walking Tour

3-5 p.m.

Discover historic Staunton, the Queen City of the Shenandoah Valley, on a walking tour guided by Historic Staunton Foundation volunteers. Tours last two hours and trace Staunton's development from frontier settlement to the booming 19th-century commercial center.

PM Woodrow Wilson Presidential Library and Museum Tour

3:30-4:30 p.m.

Take a guided tour of Wilson's birthplace, the Presbyterian Manse, the home provided by the church for the Reverend Joseph Ruggles Wilson and his family. Interpreters will take you back to 1856 when Wilson was born and discuss his family, upbringing and the lifestyle of the period. Visitors may then proceed with a self-guided tour of the museum and explore all aspects of President Wilson's life.
