Board Policy #17

Healthcare Sector Investments

It is the policy of the Virginia Growth and Opportunity Board that Per Capita funds may be used to support the healthcare industry **if a region can provide evidence that a lack of adequate healthcare services is negatively impacting its ability to grow one or more traded sector industry clusters defined in their Growth and Diversification Plan**. The Board supports **investments in workforce development** as a means of addressing the service deficiency.





Board Policy #17

Healthcare Sector Investments

Eligibility Criteria:

1) The region must provide evidence that the lack of healthcare services is affecting its ability to grow one or more of the industry clusters defined in its plan.

2) The majority of the participating localities (by population) have been designated as a Geographic Healthcare Professional Shortage Area by the Health Resources and Services Administration.

3) The effort is focused on expanding the pool of qualified workers in one or more of the occupations identified on the Virginia High Demand Occupation List (VOEE Career Clusters – Health Science) as defined by the Virginia Office of Education Economics.

4) The region can demonstrate that there is not sufficient capacity to train workers for those occupations.







Geographic Healthcare Professional Shortage Area

- Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAS) Designate **Geographic Areas** Or Subgroups Of The Populations Or Specific Facilities Within Them As Lacking Professionals In Primary Care, Mental Health, Or Dental Care.
- A Geographic HPSA Indicates a Shortage Of Providers For An Entire Group Of People Within A Defined Geographic Area
- The Primary Factor Used To Determine An HPSA designation Is The Ratio Of Health Professionals To The Population.
- Provides Alignment With Federal National Health Service Corps (NHSC) Programs That Offer Scholarships And Loan Repayment Programs. (leverage)





Virginia High Demand Occupation List (VOEE Career Clusters – Health Science)

Minimum Annual Wage At 50th Percentile Of Occupational Earnings

- \$29,160 Single Adult (200% Of Federal Poverty Level)
- **Typical Entry-level Education Range**
 - No Formal Education Required To Bachelor's Degree
- Average Annual Openings
 - Minimum 100 Openings Statewide

5-year Job Change Requirement

- Min 1% Growth Over 5-year Projection Period
- Qualified Registered Apprenticeship
 - o 10 Active Registered Apprentices
