- Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requirement
- Every 5 years DHCD asks "What needs are present in Virginia?"
 - Affordable Housing
 - Homelessness
 - O Non-Homeless Special Needs Housing
 - Non-Housing Community Development
- Every year DHCD submits an Annual Action Plan



Who completes the Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan?

- Completed by the state or localities that receive funds directly from HUD
- DHCD completes the Virginia plan for these federal resources





What's included?

- A needs assessment, a strategic plan, and annual goals
- Focuses on housing, homelessness, and community development
- Includes public input and feedback from service providers, housing developers, other state agencies, localities and continua of care



DHCD is currently seeking input on:

- 2023 2028 Consolidated Plan
- First Annual Action Plan
 - July 1, 2023 June 30, 2024

Covering the funds DHCD spends from:

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME)
- National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF)
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)
- Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA)



Key Findings

Needs Assessment Methodology:

- HUD asks DHCD to examine data from American Community Survey (ACS), the Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy (CHAS), and other sources
- DHCD uses the data to understand the nature and extent of homeless needs in Virginia
- These findings enable DHCD to inform HUD of the <u>needs</u> that the federal funding will be used to address

900,000+

Virginia households reside in substandard housing units

In 2022, the Commonwealth of Virginia's wastewater infrastructure received a

461,000

locations in Virginia still lack access to high-speed broadband internet



Based on these Key Findings, <u>past</u> priorities were:

Provide financial and technical assistance and support for:

- Comprehensive improvement in residential areas
- Development, rehabilitation or expansion of business at industrial sites and facilities
- Revitalization of business districts
- Development of entrepreneurial assistance programs
- Construction of community facilities
- New or the expansion of community services





Historic Community Development Goals

Reduce the number of substandard housing units
Increase the number of small businesses
Increase the number of jobs created or retained

Increase the number of households with access to safe and sanitary water or wastewater

Increase access to community service facilities for the provision or new or expanded services (i.e. healthcare, childcare, workforce development)







Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

Awarded to states and qualifying metropolitan areas annually on a formula basis

DHCD awards grants to non-entitlement localities in Virginia

CDBG resources must be utilized to fund:

- Low- and moderate-income benefit
- Slum and blight elimination
- Urgent community development needs



CDBG Eligible Activities

Housing Rehabilitation

- Limited project area
- Scattered site

Community Facilities

- Existing system and facilities suffer from old age and deferred maintenance
- Access to safe and sanitary water and wastewater facilities

Economic Development

- Resources for entrepreneurial and small business development
 - Access to capital
- Coordination of funds to assist with large scale economic development projects
- Access to broadband telecommunications
- Economic and physical blight



From 2018 to 2022, DHCD funded these eligible grant activities:

- Planning Grants
- Community Improvement Grants
