What is the Consolidated Plan?

- Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requirement
- Every 5 years DHCD asks "What needs are present in Virginia?"
 - Affordable Housing
 - Homelessness
 - Non-Homeless Special Needs Housing
 - Non-Housing Community Development
- Every year DHCD submits an Annual Action Plan





Who completes the Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan?

- Completed by the state or localities that receive funds directly from HUD
- DHCD completes the Virginia plan for these federal resources





What's included?

- A needs assessment, a strategic plan, and annual goals
- Focuses on housing, homelessness, and community development
- Includes public input and feedback from service providers, housing developers, other state agencies, localities and continua of care

DHCD is currently seeking input on:

- 2023 2028 Consolidated Plan
- First Annual Action Plan
 - July 1, 2023 June 30, 2024

Covering the funds DHCD spends from:

- HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME)
- National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF)
- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)
- Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA)



Housing Needs Assessment

Key Findings

Needs Assessment Methodology:

- HUD asks DHCD to examine data from American Community Survey (ACS), the Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy (CHAS), and other sources
- DHCD uses the data to understand the nature and extent of housing needs in Virginia
- These findings enable DHCD to inform HUD of the <u>needs</u> that the federal funding will be used to address

500,000+

households in Virginia are spending more than 30% of their income on housing

Most of those households have annual incomes below

\$64,492.00

Virginians with intellectual or developmental disabilities, serious mental illnesses, or who experience chronic homelessness have additional barriers to housing choice.

Based on Key Findings, <u>past</u> priorities were:



AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Targeting funds to the lowest income households



ACCESSIBLE HOUSING

Targeting funds to projects with accessible or 'age-in-place' units

 Features like wider hallways, grab bars (Universal Design, ADA)



SPECIAL NEEDS HOUSING

Increased funding to projects targeting 'special needs' housing

- Permanent, supportive housing with wraparound services
- Housing for older adults
- Housing for those exiting chronic homelessness

Priorities

Program requirements:

- Income targeting required by funding source
- HOME program requires
 - 15% funds go to CHDO developers
 - DHCD supports projects in localities without direct HOME funds
- Dept of Justice Settlement Agreement
 - DHCD must assist Virginia in providing increased, affordable housing choices to people with disabilities





Historic Goals

- Increase the number of new affordable rental units in areas of opportunity
- Preserve existing affordable rental units in areas of opportunity
- Assist low-income homeowners with home improvements (rehab)
- Assist low to moderate income households to purchase their first home
- Increase the number of affordable units for special needs populations

HOME Investments Partnerships Program (HOME)



- Some funds to localities and the rest to DHCD
- Funds wide range of activities
- All activities help create affordable housing for low-income households
 - Rental Activities: 50-60% Area Median Income (AMI)
 - Homebuyer Activities: 80% AMI





National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF)

- Funds directly from HUD to the state agency DHCD
- Funds more limited activities than HOME
- Must use 80% of NHTF for rental housing kept affordable for 30 years
- Serves extremely or very low income households: 30% AMI





From 2018 to 2022, DHCD funded these Eligible Activities:

- Rehabilitation of houses already owned by low-income families
- Grants for down payments and closing costs
- Rental assistance payments that travel with a tenant family (TBRA)
- Operating costs and capacity-building for Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDOs)
- Permanent financing on rental housing
 - This is the only National Housing Trust Fund activity funded

- Development of new rental housing units
- Rental assistance made available to households experiencing homelessness or at-risk of becoming homeless
