Activities/
Areas of Need

- (Payroll, benefits and salaries...)
- Rent, mortgage or utility payments
 - Loan payments (principle and interest)
 - Personal protective equipment, cleaning and disinfecting materials

- Housing rehabilitation and housing production for low- to moderate-income individuals
- Provision of reliable, safe, public utilities, including water and sewer
- Community service facilities, including health care and telehealth
- Infrastructure for private businesses with job creation or job retention
- Business district revitalization with economic restructuring strategy and the infrastructure to accomplish the vision
- Urgent needs recovery from an event with a declaration of emergency
- Planning grants to develop projects

- Public service facilities (operating costs for community assistance programs, employment/workforce training, equipment and sanitization services, rent/mortgage payments, housing counseling)
- Housing- related activities housing rehabilitation, construction, lead abatement, homeownership assistance
- Public improvements and facilities (multi-purpose centers, isolation shelters and testing centers)
- Economic development activities (commercial/industrial building acquisition, construction and rehabilitation, micro-enterprise assistance)

The goal of the GO Virginia program is to encourage and incentive regional collaboration, execute strategies that help to grow and diversify regional economies and support the creation of high-paying jobs.

Priority investment areas include workforce development, sites/infrastructure (including middle mile broadband), start up ecosystem and innovation and cluster scale up (sector-based strategies to grow traded sector industry clusters).



Timelines

Application open Aug. 10, 2020

Competitive applications are due in the late spring and late fall of each calendar year.

Open submission programs are open from Jan. 1-Sept.30

Applications accepted on a rolling basis Jan. 1-Sept.30

Varies by Region; under \$100,000 approved administratively
